through case studies of collectors patrons and agents who redefined collecting and the art market this volume illuminates how the changing status of the artist rise of connoisseurship role of intermediaries and new patterns of consumption established models for collecting and display that resemble those still practiced today the book presents new research by recognized scholars who examine the motivations of collectors and agents emphasizing how their collecting patronage and advocacy could require support of artists whose reputations were not fully established together the essays invite consideration of works that are familiar in art historical terms but less so as markers of the socio economic shifts of a particular cultural moment this book evolved from a symposium when michelangelo was modern the art market and collecting in italy 1450 1650 organized by the center for the history of collecting that was held at the frick collection on april 12 and 13 2019 both the book and the symposium were made possible through the generous support of the robert h smith family foundation the book is published in association with the frick collection

ever since herodotus declared in histories that to preserve the memories of the great achievements of the greeks and other nations he would count on their own stories historians have debated whether and how they should deal with myth most have sided with thucydides who denounced myth as unscientific and banished it from historiography in mythistory joseph mali revives this oldest controversy in historiography contesting the conventional opposition between myth and history mali advocates instead for a historiography that reconciles the two and recognizes the crucial role that myth plays in the construction of personal and communal identities the task of historiography he argues is to illuminate not eliminate these fictions by showing how they have passed into and shaped historical reality drawing on the works of modern theorists and artists of myth such as nietzsche and wittgenstein joyce and eliot mali redefines modern historiography and relates it to the older notion and tradition of mythistory tracing the origins and transformations of this historiographical tradition from the ancient world to the modern mali shows how livy and machiavelli sought to recover true history from uncertain myth and how vico and michelet then reversed this pattern of inquiry seeking instead to recover a deeper and truer myth from uncertain history in the heart of mythistory mali turns his attention to four thinkers who rediscovered myth in and for modern cultural history jacob burckhardt aby warburg ernst kantorowicz and walter benjamin his elaboration of the different biographical and historiographical routes by which all four sought to account for the persistence and significance of myth in western civilization opens up new perspectives for an alternative intellectual history of modernity one that may better explain the proliferation of mythic imageries of redemption in our secular all too secular times

quixotic frescoes delves into the politics of imitation self censorship religious ideology expressed through the pictorial as well as the gendering of art as reflected in cervantes work

de arte venandi cum avibus was written shortly before the year 1250 by frederick ii holy roman emperor king of sicily and jerusalem in whose court with its remarkably cosmopolitan and highly intellectual life may be found the real beginning of the italian renaissance in spite of its title it is far more than a dissertation on hunting there is a lengthy introduction dealing with the anatomy of birds an intensely interesting description of avian habits and the excursions of migratory birds indeed this ancient

book has long been recognized as the first zoological treatise written in the critical spirit of modern science the sumptuous volume now in hand is however the first translation into english of the complete text originally divided into a prologue and size books together the translators and editors have at last made available this classic work and have adorned it with notes comments bibliographies and glossary they have produced a work of great value to zoologists especially the ornithologist and also to everyone interested in the history of science and in medieval art and letters
