why write another book on ethics as practitioners we are involved both in the design and delivery of services to people with mental health problems in common with all other professionals our work has led to the experience of ethical dilemmas typically these have involved major confrontations either with our colleagues or our consciences this book however is not limited to a discussion of such major themes rather we have tried to use a broader canvas ethics in our view is really about the judgement of right and wrong in ordinary everyday life ethics are highly personal we fashion our own personal code from our experience of others and from the tests which bring meaning to our lives such experiences shape our individual values we bring these codes and values to our work we are not always aware of their influence in our dealings with people although we may not always be aware of it all our actions pose an ethical question given that our work involves us in helping others to live ordinary satisfying lives this challenge heightens the intensity of our ethical dilemmas this is most evident where our personal code conflicts with the implicit code of the health setting

this book provides in depth analyses of a wide range of topics surrounding ethical issues in community and patient stakeholder engaged health research and highlights where consensus exists is emerging or remains elusive topics in this book cover the history of stakeholder engagement in health research how codes of ethics and regulations have or have not addressed stakeholder engagement how to promote equitable collaboration the ethical perspectives of different stakeholders and the unique challenges posed by stakeholder engaged research to the protection of human research participants and the research ethics review process the book includes discussion of unique issues that arise in stakeholder engagement relevant to different populations settings and research designs this book is relevant for anyone with a role or interest in stakeholder engaged research including patient and community research partners academic researchers research ethics scholars and educators and funders

studies involving children with mental emotional or behavioral problems or their families have to meet certain standards of research ethics this book contains chapters on the kinds of ethical dilemmas that typically occur in different types of studies of children and then presents 65 real world cases from experts who study children s mental health these experts offer practical suggestions for how to handle these dilemmas chapters on the perspectives of parents regulators and bioethicists provide additional points of view on these issues written in down to earth language this book will be useful for professionals who study children for those who train students in research methods and for parents who are thinking about participating in research studies in attempting to bridge the apparent gap between ethics and science the editors close this volume on a note commonly sounded by researchers more research is needed yet in this area a new kind of research is required the science of scientific ethics must be developed and expanded and better understanding of the determinants and circumstances under which children can comprehend and evaluate risks and benefits is needed likewise fuller knowledge of the contextual factors affecting children s and families consent to participate in research is essential in particular development of scales to assess children s ability to comprehend risk benefit issues studies of families reactions to research procedures and empirical data on the impact of various forms of participant reimbursement will advance both science and ethics this volume should spur further research serving as a guide for current investigators participating families institutional review boards and policymakers who shape the research enterprise

this casebook collects 64 case studies each of which raises an important and difficult ethical issue connected with planning reviewing or conducting health related research the book s purpose is to contribute to thoughtful analysis of these issues by researchers and members of research ethics committees recs known in some places as ethical review committees or institutional review boards particularly those involved with studies that are conducted or sponsored internationally this collection is envisioned principally as a tool to aid educational programs from short workshops on research ethics to in service learning for scientists and rec members to formal degree or certificate courses in such settings instructors will typically select a number of case studies that will be distributed to the participants to provoke and focus discussion to assist those using these case studies in their classrooms and workshops a teaching guide has been included individuals who want to stimulate their own thinking about research ethics or to become more familiar with a range of real world dilemmas in international health research especially in developing countries may also benefit from perusing this book either on topics of special interest to them or as a whole

first published in 1994 this is volume 2 of a selection of studies in applied ethics focusing on ethical issues in scientific research in aid to support students when applying ethics to their research training courses the need for these courses expresses the recognition that the ethical dimensions of various types of scientific research greatly affect the general population and therefore require serious study and debate this collection of essays addresses the major areas of moral debate regarding research fraud and deception controlled experiments on humans animal and genetic research iq and military research the essays collected here represent the best efforts to date of philosophers and scientists to grapple with these interesting and difficult issues

this book provides an exploration of the ethics of cardiology practice it provides a variety of frameworks for analyzing ethical issues that arise in cardiovascular medicine cardiovascular medicine the diagnosis and treatment of congenital and acquired diseases of the heart major arteries and veins has seen rapid change in diagnosis treatment and the organization of practice in the last half of the twentieth and the beginning of the twenty first century the complexity of these developments has resulted in increasing subspecialization and many practitioners are challenged to stay abreast with the latest developments in cardiology these changes also bring with them various ethical challenges the chapters in this volume are divided by five broad areas of practice beginning of life end of life transplantation and allocation of expensive or scarce resources professionalism and research the case based approach presented across the volume provides a perspective that will allow readers to reason through current and future ethical issues as they arise in this rapidly changing field ethical issues in cardiovascular medicine will be of interest to researchers working in bioethics clinical ethics and the philosophy of medicine as well as practicing physicians nurses and students who work in cardiovascular medicine

how do we know right from wrong good from bad help from hindrance and how can we judge the behaviour of others ethics are the rules and guidelines that we use to make such judgements often there are no clear answers which make this subject both interesting and potentially frustrating in this book the authors offer readers the opportunity to develop and express their own opinions in relation to ethics in psychology there are many psychological studies that appear to have been harmful or cruel to the people or animals

that took part in them for example memory researchers carried out studies on a man who had no memory for over forty years but because he had no memory he was never able to agree to the studies is this a reasonable thing to do to someone comparative psychologist harry harlow found that he could create severe and lasting distress in monkeys by keeping them in social isolation is this a reasonable thing to do even if we find out useful things about human distress if you were able to use psychological techniques to break someone down so that they revealed information that was useful to your government would you do it if so why if not why not these ethical issues are not easy to resolve and the debates continue as we encounter new dilemmas this book uses examples from psychological research to look at key ethical issues ethical guidelines of psychologists socially sensitive research ethics in applied psychology the use of animals in research this book is essential reading for undergraduate and pre undergraduate students of psychology and related subjects such as philosophy and social policy

the use of human beings as research subjects poses distinctive ethical issues subjects of medical research are exposed to risks of harm for the sake of generating scientific knowledge that can benefit future patients and society ethical analysis of the challenges posed by research involving human subjects requires careful attention to the contextual details of scientific experimentation this book contains 22 essays by franklin g miller on research ethics written over a 15 year period with the exception of the first essay all have been previously published in bioethics and medical journals the book is arranged into four parts part one addresses a general ethical perspective on the protection of human subjects in clinical research including paternalism in research regulation and acceptable limits to research risks the essays in part two examine ethical issues in study design it includes ethical analyses of controversial types of medical experimentation studies that provoke psychiatric symptoms induce infections provide patients with placebos that withhold proven effective treatments or administer fake invasive procedures test experimental treatments in cancer patients who have exhausted all standard treatment options and employ the use of deception to generate scientifically valid data part three offers a systematic critique of the therapeutic orientation to clinical trials and the principle of clinical equipoise which is widely regarded as a fundamental norm for randomized treatment studies part four takes up a range of ethical issues relating to informed consent for research participation including examination of the therapeutic

misconception and presentation of a novel approach to the validity of consent the fair transaction model an abiding theme developed in many of the essays is that the ethics of clinical research is importantly different from the ethics of medical care

this is an edited collection exploring ethical issues in women s health care it includes topics related to reproduction but goes beyond this familiar theme to address clinical and social issues largely unrecognized in the bioethics literature these include ethical issues related to the care of indigenous women uninsured refugees and immigrants rural women women engaged in sex work and those with hiv and perinatal mental health disorders the collection analyzes the complex ways in which practice policy and institutional structures intersect and raise ethical issues affecting women s access to health care contributors comprise an interdisciplinary group of practitioners including physicians clinical ethicists and nurses as well academic scholars

in memory of ethics a dissection of ethical and social issues in pakistani professional healthcare practice explores the ethical challenges faced within the healthcare sector with a focus on pakistan from workplace behaviors to medical procedures covid 19 era dilemmas and broader social health concerns the book explores the intricate intersection of ethics and healthcare in the region the book is divided into five sections section i covers topics such as workplace behaviors and ethical conducts while section ii covers medical procedures and patient doctor relationships section iii addresses the unique ethical challenges brought forth by the covid 19 pandemic including guidelines for therapists and the ethics of mandatory vaccinations section iv examines the impact of social media on healthcare gender discrimination and the ethical considerations surrounding prisoner rehabilitation the final section offers insightful essays on ethical and social issues covering topics like body shaming free healthcare and patient privacy the editors also explore controversial topics including euthanasia abortion and assisted reproductive technology the key feature of this book is that it provides a comprehensive coverage of diverse ethical dilemmas in healthcare furthermore it is an attempt to give a subjective understanding of healthcare ethics through thought provoking essays shedding light on contemporary ethical issues in a pakistani context the contributors have incorporated real world examples and case studies to illustrate ethical principles in action in memory of ethics a dissection of ethical and social issues in pakistani
