any serious observer of hawaii s architecture will be struck by the frequent recurrence of one name charles dickey this prolific and multifaceted architect enjoyed a remarkably successful career from the intimate tropical bungalows he designed in waikiki to the large scale commercial projects and schools that dominated his california years dickey s work exhibits both eclecticism and diversity for many years the preeminent figure in hawaii architecture he is often identified with the development of a uniquely hawaiian style the first individual raised in hawaii to receive a classic architectural education in the u s dickey joined the honolulu firm of clinton b ripley in 1896 in the years that followed the ripley dickey partnership played an enormous role in transforming both the burgeoning business district and the residential neighborhoods of the city working in a wide variety of architectural styles the young dickey reflected both his own historicist training and the diverse demands of his corporate clients in turn of the century honolulu he also began to explore the vernacular traditions of hawaiian architecture traditions that would form the basis for his later work in hawaii and become a signature of his style in 1905 dickey relocated to oakland where although he encountered keener competition than he had known in honolulu he enjoyed a successful practice for twenty years of particular interest are his experiments with california s mission style architecture and his innovative use of structural steel which enhanced his reputation in the aftermath of the san francisco earthquake it was there too that he added japanese architectural traditions to his increasing range of stylistic options upon his return to honolulu
