several years ago after many years of writing nonfiction I decided to write a novel a medical thriller in the mold of Robin Cook Michael Crichton and Michael Palmer the problem was that although I knew how to write and had received a number of awards for nonfiction works I didn't know the how

to write fiction so before putting fingers to keyboard i did a thorough search of the literature which included reading numerous books and hundreds of website articles what i discovered was that there simply wasn't one good source from which to learn the craft of writing genre fiction writing genre fiction a guide to the craft is the book i was looking for when i set out on my quest to learn how to write fiction it is an attempt to share what i learned from my research it covers the six key elements of genre fiction the various genres and subgenres a large number of genre fiction writing techniques plot subplots and parallel plots structure scene and sequel characterization dialogue emotions and body language it also covers additional information about copyrighting and plagiarism where to get ideas manuscript formatting and revision and query letters and synopses in addition an appendix covers a large number of grammar tips
