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excellent especially insightful are articles on ethics and gender autonomy and pornography feelings and a responsible and democratic epistemology choice the essays in this book introduce to american readers the work of a group of british feminist philosophers representing both the continental and the analytic traditions who argue that philosophy is in urgent need of a feminist perspective

with twelve new essays this third edition of marilyn pearsall s landmark collection continues to offer readers the vanguard thinking of today s outstanding feminist philosophers the book s thirty six readings all by contemporary feminists reflect their views on such topics as abortion sexual harassment religion aesthetics motherhood lesbianism rights and caring for ease of reference the essays are organized topically into eight chapters feminist theory and practice women s nature and values social philosophy political philosophy philosophy of law philosophy of religion philosophy of art and feminist ethics with substantive introductions to each chapter this provocative collection offers enticing coverage of a full range of feminist issues in a format accessible to readers from back cover

to what extent has the emergence of the study of religion in western culture been gendered this work proposes a new philosophy of religion from a feminist perspective

feminist ethics and social and political philosophy theorizing the non ideal is a collection of feminist essays that self consciously develop non idealizing approaches to either ethics or social and political philosophy or both characterizing feminist ethics and social and political philosophy as marked by a tendency to be non idealizing serves to thematize the volume while still allowing the essays to be diverse enough to constitute a representation of current work in the fields of feminist ethics and social and political philosophy each of the essays either serves as an instance of work that is rooted in actual non ideal conditions and that as

such is able to consider any of the many questions relevant to subordinated people or reflects theoretically on the significance of non idealizing as an approach to feminist ethics or social and political philosophy the volume will be of interest to feminist scholars from all disciplines to academics who are ethicists and political philosophers as well as to graduate students

this volume explores urgent questions surrounding the bidirectional relationship between feminist philosophy and emerging technologies it underlines the exigency of feminist philosophical reflections on the design use and understanding of emerging technologies and at the same time accentuates how emerging technologies can uniquely impact the shape of future feminist critique and intervention while feminist philosophers have attended to problems posed by a few specific technologies that emerged in the previous century especially reproductive technologies broader philosophical questions concerning the challenges various new technologies present to feminism have yet to receive the sustained critical attention they deserve feminist philosophy and emerging technologies responds to this problem it is divided into two sections section 1 provides theoretical considerations about the links between feminist philosophy and philosophy of technology broadly construed by developing against the background of emerging technologies methodological approaches and guidance for bringing those two fields of philosophical research together section 2 is dedicated to analyses of specific emerging technologies and user trends their relation to extant structures of oppression and to bringing to the fore various ways in which a feminist philosophy of technology can impact the design of current and future technologies feminist philosophy and emerging technologies is an excellent resource for scholars and advanced students working in feminist philosophy philosophy of technology ethics political philosophy feminist theory gender and cultural studies and science and technology studies

presenting essays rich with her own personal experiences philosopher linda a bell examines not only her own life but also problems arising from ways that living affects thinking she

reflects on her own experience in order to challenge a variety of provocative claims including that affirmative action harms those it is designed to help that suicide while perhaps acceptable for some with fatal diseases is otherwise a manifestation of mental illness that women are to blame for male violence toward them if they don't leave the relationships that a low profile is the best path to success for women in academe that women are treated fairly in academe perhaps even better than men and that political correctness is a recent and aberrant move away from respect for freedom of speech although drawing from experience as she creates and critiques theory bell argues against the view that it is the bedrock of theory

drawing attention to the vexed relationship between feminist theory and philosophy is feminist philosophy philosophy demonstrates the spectrum of significant work being done at this contested boundary the volume offers clear statements by seventeen distinguished scholars as well as a full range of philosophical approaches it also presents feminist philosophers in conversation both as feminists and as philosophers making the book accessible to a wide audience
