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the spirituality of the cross presents adults with a true understanding of christianity one that is grounded in christ s death and resurrection the author presents a true understanding of justification by faith the means of grace the two kingdoms worship and the church this third edition will be updated throughout to include modern examples and new material will discuss such issues as secularism the use of the term spirituality the materiality of creation incarnation and the sacraments an expanded discussion of vocation new age references and popular errors e g prosperity gospel

the first of its kind this book provides a cross cultural perspective on ecology and religion the book surveys and discusses concepts of ecology in traditional cultures asian religious traditions and contemporary culture includes substantial

discussions of current ecological movements and several ecovisionaries for anyone interested in religious studies

this book examines what people mean when they say they are spiritual it looks at the semantics of spirituality the visibility of reasons for spiritual preference in biographies in psychological dispositions in cultural differences between germany and the us and in gender differences it also examines the kind of biographical consequences that are associated with spirituality the book reports the results of an online questionnaire filled out by 773 respondents in germany and 1113 in the us personal interviews with a selected group of more than 100 persons and an experiment based on the data collected it reports results that are relevant for a number of scientific and practical disciplines it makes a contribution to the semantics of everyday religious language and to the cross cultural study of religion and to many related fields as well because spirituality is evaluated in relation to personality mysticism well being religious styles generativity attachment biography and atheism the book draws attention to the new and ever changing ways in which people give names to their ultimate concern and symbolize their experiences of transcendence

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most studies of paul concentrate solely on his theology this book breaks new ground by focusing on the source and nature

of paul s spirituality taking his cue from paul s express desire to know nothing but christ crucified michael gorman shows how paul s personal experience of god constantly intersects with the story of the cross an event that both reveals the cruciform character of god and shapes believers into a community of cruciformity conformity to the crucified christ expertly combining biblical studies and theological reflection this noteworthy volume presents a model of the christian life marked by faith love power and hope

this is an introduction to the spiritual canticle by john of the cross it gives all the necessary background for anyone who wishes to approach this great spiritual work with appropriate preparation in order to reap the benefits of one of the most challenging works in the history of spirituality the book starts with the life of john of the cross showing how he was always a model of love in his own life and how guided by his own experience he became a teacher of human and divine love while the spiritual canticle is johns greatest love poem there are others and so we examine his work and ministry as a poet of human and divine love the book provides the needed historical religious and personal background to appreciate and locate its content the book then presents the links between john s spiritual canticle and scripture s love poem the song of songs a summary of john s own work brings readers in direct contact with the challenges of the message and its application today with these preparations in mind the book moves on to present the stages of the spiritual life and the importance of the journey of love the book then focuses on key concepts in the spiritual canticle applying each of them to contemporary situations finally it considers the images of god presented in the book and how they relate to the spiritual journey

this book explores the nature of spirituality its relationship to religion and the reasons for its importance in clinical practice different chapters focus on the key subspecialties of psychiatry including psychotherapy child and adolescent psychiatry

intellectual disability psychiatry substance misuse psychiatry and old age psychiatry
