research writing to introductory students by drawing on communication  
ethics holding to the current view that academic writing means situating  
ourselves in a research community and learning how to join the research  
conversations going on around us joining the dialogue proposes that how we  
engage in dialogue with other researchers in our community matters we not

only read acknowledge and build on the research of others as we compose our work we also engage openly attentively critically and responsively to their ideas as we articulate our own with this in mind joining the dialogue is geared to helping students discover the key ethical practices of dialogue receptivity and response ability as they join a research conversation it also helps students master the dialogic structure of research essays as they write in and for their academic communities combining an ethical approach with accessible prose dialogic structures and templates practical exercises and ample illustrations from across the disciplines joining the dialogue teaches students not only how to write research essays but also how to write those essays ethically as a dialogue with other researchers and readers

intergroup dialogue is a form of democratic engagement that fosters communication critical reflection and collaborative action across social and cultural divides engaging social identities is central to this approach in recent years intergroup dialogue has emerged as a promising social justice education practice that addresses pressing issues in higher education school and community settings this edited volume provides a thoughtful and comprehensive overview of intergroup dialogue spanning conceptual frameworks for practice and most notably a diverse set of research studies which examine in detail the processes and learning that take place through dialogue this book addresses questions from the fields of education social psychology sociology and social work offering specific recommendations and examples related to curriculum and pedagogy furthermore it contributes to an understanding of how to constructively engage students and others in education about difference identities and social justice this book was originally published as a special issue of equity excellence in education

in recent years countries around the world introduced numerous national security programs and military campaigns despite the complex legal questions they raise very few of these measures have been the subject of rigorous judicial review nevertheless the absence of real time review has had an enormous effect on human rights rule of law and on national security the supreme court of israel provides an excellent case study of a different approach which allows judges to assess military action in real time and to issue non binding results of their evaluation this raises the question how was the court actually able to uphold this challenge in judicial review of national security david scharia explains how the supreme court of israel developed unconventional judicial review tools and practices that allowed it to provide judicial guidance to the executive in real time in this book he argues that courts could play a much more dominant role in reviewing national security and demonstrates the importance of intensive real time inter branch dialogue with the executive as a tool used by the israeli court to provide such review this book aims to show

that if one supreme court was able to provide rigorous judicial review of national security in real time then we should reconsider the conventional wisdom regarding the limits of judicial review of national security
