academic english is an eap course book syllabus including ielts practice sections it combines a comprehensive syllabus and reliable teaching resources work book exercises and complete resource lists making it the primary text for eap teachers and students alike both as a study guide for students and a source book for teachers this course book has been designed for the international student wishing to study academic english and seeking to achieve a level that will gain direct entry into a college or university of choice in a western country like australia the united kingdom or the united states of america it is also designed for students who wish to bring their level of english up to an acceptable international standard but not necessarily wishing to go overseas for further study the lesson structure has been designed by a team of professional ielts and academic english teachers and is enhanced by a set of published resources readily available in most countries of the world

english for academic study extended writing research skills eas extended writing research skills takes students step by step through the process of producing an extended piece of academic writing helping them to develop the writing and research skills necessary for the task students make use of the source materials that accompany the course to produce their own piece of extended writing they are then encouraged to use the strategies they have learned to produce a second piece of writing within their own field of study the approach allows students to work independently supported by detailed information and advice as well we model answers provided

in both the course book and the instructor's manual the units are organized as follows: introduction to the skills of extended writing and research using evidence to support your ideas, structuring your project and finding information, developing your project, developing a focus, introductions, conclusions and definitions, incorporating data and illustrations, preparing for conference presentations and editing your work. Each unit has weblinks offering additional information and activities. A dedicated website englishforacademicstudy.com offers further instructor resources. This book can be used in conjunction with the following books in the English for Academic Study series, also published by Garnet Education: EAS Reading, EAS Listening, EAS Vocabulary and EAS Speaking Pronunciation.

This book features five theme-based units on cross-disciplinary academic English skills focusing on the needs of first-year undergraduate students. Each unit covers academic writing, reading and speaking skills. The units progressively take students through the steps needed to complete three common academic assignments: the essay, report and tutorial discussion. These steps include searching for quality sources, note-taking, establishing a critical stance, formulating evidence-based arguments, synthesizing information from multiple sources and structuring academic texts. Each unit also provides opportunities for students to analyse texts, apply their critical thinking skills, practise what they have learnt in productive tasks and reflect upon their progress. This book is aimed at first-time university students. Many of the readings are related to China and a broader Asian context, as such it appeals to first-year university students in Hong Kong, mainland China and Taiwan.

The Academic English A course is designed to empower students by providing them with key skills that are relevant to university and professional workplace environments. Throughout the series, learners will cultivate their communicative competencies in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Each textbook focuses on two academic content areas with a variety of engaging student-centered activities that encourage active learning and critical thinking. QR codes provide easy access to supplementary online materials. A practical skills section in each unit provides learners with an opportunity to practice and develop their research writing and public speaking abilities.

Scientific English is possibly the most rewarding area of EFL teaching. It differs from English for Academic Purposes (EAP) as it is directed to a much smaller audience: PhD and postdoc students. Courses on Scientific English are held in universities throughout the world, yet there is very little support for teachers in understanding what to teach and how to teach it. This book will help you: i) understand the world of your students, i.e. academic research; ii) plan courses; and iii) exploit the 'what's the buzz' sections in the books on writing, presentations, correspondence and interacting on campus.
